The weather is very hot.



The temperature doesn't drop, or drops very little, at night.



It lasts for 3 days or longer.

DRINK WATER
REGULARLY



Moisten your skin
with water
and use a fan



Ensure you eat
sufficiently



Avoid strenuous
activities



Avoid drinking
alcohol

closed during the day
